Vacation! What a wonderful word. It is something we all look forward to. Most people, even those not serious about photography, take pictures while on vacation. There are two ways we can use photography effectively on our trips.

We can use photography to document our adventures. Where did we go? What did we do? With whom did we do it? So, I find it helpful to take pictures of signs and information. That way, at home, I can remember those spots that I have photographed. Include interesting photos of activities: hiking trails, museums, and even memorable restaurants. Keep in mind good composition, like watching for lighting and backgrounds. Include photos of your

companions and even yourself. I like to take group shots. Use a great scenic background or position your group at the sign of an important spot, such as the entrance to a National Park.

A second way of involving photography in our vacations is to specifically take advantage of the unique locations and scenery. Plan ahead for that special spot, such as a waterfall or historical site. It may involve using specific equipment like a tripod or wide-angle lens.

On my most recent trip to the Upper Peninsula of Michigan, I planned for a photo that I have wanted to take for many years. The place is called Lake of the Clouds in the Porcupine Mountains State Park. The best view of this lake is looking east, so I knew I wanted to get a sunrise. Here is where the planning came in. I planned for our group to stay a couple of nights at cabin that was close enough to easily get there early in the morning. We went there the day before to check out views and locations. So, the first morning, we got up early, loaded up our equipment, and headed out. The weather was fine when left for the 8 mile drive up the mountain. But as we got to

the top, it started raining. We were drenched by the rain waiting for the sunrise that didn't materialize. We didn't see the sun until we drove back down and saw it over Lake Superior. The rain was localized on the mountain. What a disappointment! But I did get some rain photos.

This is where the second night at the cabin came in. I got up the next morning (the other two were afraid to try it again) and headed out. I was rewarded with one of the most beautiful sunrises I have ever seen. The lesson is to be persistent; don't give up. Things don't always turn out as they are planned, but this time, it worked out.

On your adventures, plan ahead, but allow for the unexpected to happen. Enjoy what is before you. Make the best of it!


