APRIL MEETING

Wayne Pope will be doing a presentation on "Basic Bird Photography: topics include best camera and lenses, shooting methods with digital SLRs and smartphones, leaning bird behavior, editing, saving, sharing & printing photos."

Wayne is an adjunct associate professor of photography at Lansing Community College and teaches a variety of photo courses through their Adult Enrichment Program. He was certified as an Advanced Indiana Master Naturalist in 2018 and leads nature workshops at Indiana Dunes State Park, Potato Creek State Park, and Pokagon State Park in Indiana.

Wayne published a new book in 2023 entitled, "Birds of Michigan: Notable Species Volume 1"



PRESIDENT'S CORNER



These days people take a lot of photos. It is easy to do with digital cameras, whether they be a cell phone or a more advanced camera. With film, you usually were limited to 24 or 36 pictures on a roll. But with the memory cards where images are stored, you can take hundreds or thousands. This leaves us with a problem. How do you deal with so many? Selecting photos is a very important topic in photography.

I have noticed that on social media, some people take a photo dump. That means they dump a large number of images on a posting. I am uncomfortable with using the word "dump" with photography. Many times, if you look at this gigantic group of photos, you will see many repetitive or poor-quality photos. It

is my strong opinion that we should thoughtfully select photos that we share or display.

The question becomes, how do you select photos? There are many reasons to choose specific images. First, quality is more important than quantity. If someone shares 100 photos, will you want to look at them all? Would it be more enjoyable to view 5 or 10 good ones that tell the same story? On Facebook, you can post up to 5 photos without having some hidden. That is my general guideline for sharing on social media.

Secondly, the reason to select may be the topic of a contest or exhibit. In that case, you are looking to find the photo(s) that fit. Third, select based on composition, technical merit, and other visual factors. Look for what is pleasing to the eye and attracts attention. Use the "Wow Factor" to decide.

Here is one example. I took photos at a wedding of a relative. I started out with over 3000 images. I winnowed the candidate photos down to 616 by taking out the rejects and duplicates that had better alternates. Finally, working with the bride, they were narrowed down to 76 photos that were printed and put in a keepsake album.

Recently, the Duneland Photography Club had a photoshoot at Brincka-Cross Gardens. Those who were there know the challenge of selecting photos. That is part of the fun of it. Which photos strike a chord with you? For me, out of 340 I took that day, I may share 5 or 10. Part of the creative process is making decisions. Here is one of my favorites.


MARCH MEETING RECAP

Carol Estes presented information on the topic of Light Painting.


Carol's knowledge and helpful tips on light painting were presented with both slides of examples of photos taken using different methods of light painting and also,




WILHELMINA'S EXHIBIT




