

PRESIDENT'S CORNER



In many ways, photography has changed over the years. The cameras and equipment are quite different. How the image is captured and preserved has improved. But the basic idea is the same, using light to make an image.


On the website historyfacts.com there is an article "The First Candid Photograph of a Person was Taken in 1838." Try to picture this. About 200 years ago, photography was in its infancy. In England and

France, people were trying to figure out how to make photographic representation of people and things.

The first photograph was credited to Joseph Nicéphore Niépce in 1827, titled "View from the Window at Le Gras.". It was quite a feat, using a camera obscura with a light-sensitive metal plate. From our perspective, it had a very low ISO (sensitivity), because the exposure of the scene took several DAYS! This would not work for making portraits.

A couple years later, Niépce met Louis-Jacques-Mandé Daguerre. They worked together to create the daguerreotype, which had the advantage of a "quick" shutter speed of 4 or 5 MINUTES. It was quite an improvement!

In 1838, Daguerre created the attached image. It is believed to be the first one with a person in it. Taken at Boulevard du Temple in Paris, there was a man having his shoes shined. This unknown man was holding still long enough to be



captured in this image. So this became known as the first "candid photograph."

Photography has changed much over the last 200 years. Our cameras today stop the action of an athlete in motion, a bullet breaking through glass, or splash of a water drop. Even though the technology has advanced, the most important part of a photo is the vision and skill of the photographer behind it.

At the Duneland Photography Club we help each other succeed in making good photos. We teach the "how to" skills and encourage the creativity of the mind.

John was honored with the August Volunteer Spotlight for the Indiana Dunes National Park.


Get to Know John Roquet:

What do you enjoy most about volunteering? Working with the people I meet in the park and talking to visitors.




GEORGE KASSAL






