

The Duneland Photography Club meets the first Tuesday of each month.



We want the latest camera, that new lens, or that photography gadget. We can learn to be content with what we have as far as equipment goes. But we can also want more in our abilities or the qualities of the photos we create.

Each of us has some type of camera equipment, whether it is a cell phone, film camera, DSLR, or mirrorless digital camera. Do you know all the capabilities of your camera? Do you take advantage of all your camera can do? Or do you just use the auto settings and take just what the camera gives you?

I once met a photographer who intentionally uses old or cheap cameras to challenge himself to be creative. He took the oldest DSLR he had on a photo shoot. It did not have the latest bells and whistles. He was forced to work around the limitations of his equipment, but ended up with some very creative images. On the other hand, I met someone a few years ago that had a collection of very expensive cameras that gathered dust because he did not know how to use them.

Will having a new camera with more advanced features make you a better photographer? Or will mastering the equipment you have help you learn techniques that you weren't aware of? I am sure I don't even know half of the features that exist on my cameras, let alone use them. Maybe we

can challenge ourselves to learn something new with what we have until we really have the need for more advanced equipment?

To me, the camera is a tool to create an image. The most important part of making that image is the vision, imagination, and skill of the photographer. I believe I can create memorable art with a \$10 disposable camera. The key is to understand the capabilities and limitations of the tool I am using.

Be thankful for the opportunities you have. At the Duneland Photography Club, we strive to help each other grow as photographers. Don't be content with what you know today. Learn more each day and challenge yourself to try something new!

Steve presented information on the "Wow" factor. Steve's examples of what to keep in mind when taking photos that would have elements in them to create images that have a Wow effect were very helpful.

Steve explained how composition, perspective, and color balance can all be used to make an image so interesting that we would say Wow.

He told us that he is always on the watch for what he calls a serendipitous happening. He also shared how techniques such as using HDR and styles of editing can also make a big difference in how the final image we take can look. Great ideas and advice was shared. We should tell a story with our photos, make them unique and make them our own style.

The show continues at 255 and 257 Indiana Ave. in Valparaiso through November 14th.





Teresa's travels took her through western North Dakota with a side trip down the Enchanted Highway, an artwork installation of oversized sculptures. It truly is enchanting.





our common experience.


Iceland truly is the land of fire and ice. It's a place of raw natural invigorating beauty. It is certainly a place that should be high on one's bucket list!
