MAY MEETING

The May meeting of the Duneland Photography Club will be Wayne Richard Pope leading a lesson on “Basic Smartphone Photography: Learn How to Capture Better Photos and Edit, Save, and Share Them with Family.”

The meeting is Tuesday, May 6th at Sunset Hill Farm County Park in the Horton Family Education Center. at 6:00pm. Doors open at 5:00pm for mentoring.



PRESIDENT'S CORNER



Photography is the art of capturing moments and pieces of the world around us, using light. When we take a photo, we cut a slice of life. The question all photographers face is, "How do I choose that moment, that part of reality, that I want to represent in my picture?" The act of making that decision about what to include in my image is called editing.

The question is not "Should I edit my photos?", but "How should I edit my work?" There are two main opportunities to edit. The first is when I take the photo with my camera. The second is doing something with that image afterwards.

It should be apparent that the most important type of editing involves the use of the camera. I decide where I will point the camera. I choose the subject, the viewpoint, the composition (what I want to include in the frame and how it enhances or detracts from my subject), the lighting, cropping (moving closer or farther away), and many other things. There are also technical issues that I must consider, for example, what lens to use (wide angle or telephoto, etc.), the shutter speed (stopping the action or creating blur), the focus (what do I focus on?), the aperture (how much of the image do I want in focus?), the ISO (how much light do I have available?), and so on. These decisions are critical. Many things cannot be changed after the fact. For instance, if I take a photo in front of a subject, I cannot change the angle afterwards and see it from the side. If I use a slow shutter speed, I cannot fix my blurred moving subject.

The second type of editing involves taking the captured image and doing something with it. With those who use film, a negative is developed and a final print is made in a darkroom. How that print turns out depends on the editing choice made, such as cropping,

darkening or lightening the image, adjusting the color, etc. With digital photography a similar process is used. Instead of a negative, the camera produces a computer file. That file can be edited, using software, to achieve the desired result. In simple terms, I can edit by cropping, adjusting lighting, color, etc. I can make changes, but I cannot "fix" a bad image that is out of focus or taken from a bad angle. Nevertheless, I can enhance a good image to best show my vision of what I want to portray.

At the Duneland Photography Club we help each other learn to take better photos. This starts with learning to use our tool, the camera. Then we learn how to edit this image to make a finished product. This picture should then convey our perception, so others can visualize the story we want to tell.

APRIL MEETING RECAP

Program speaker for the meeting was Joel Alderson. The topic was "Finding Cool Subjects".

Joel began his presentation by talking about how he got into photography. His Dad was a photographer in the Navy and was also a portrait photographer, so Joel has been around photography all his life. He engaged us by asking what we like to photograph. Then Joel shared with the club some of his "Cool" photos such as gears from a photocopying machine to surf boards on a stormy day and an image of a rusty mailbox being taken over by wild growing vines. The message throughout his presentation was clear: be on the watch for images

that are interesting, show emotion, and capture a bit of history. We should photograph using different perspectives and always be aware of the composition. Take advantage of the golden hour and capture your subject using beautiful light. This will enhance texture and shadows in your work. Most importantly, he encouraged us to get out and take photos!

Show and Tell theme was Creative Photos. Many members participated in the evening's show and tell including Paul Ewing, Tom Mathewson, Derek Viehman, John Roquet, Steve Bensing, Matt Kowalski, Scott Harness, Patrice Lawson, and Terry Fairchild.





ARTISTS' GUILD OF VALPARAISO


