The question is, what do we do with them?

I have many photos, not only

ones I have taken, but family photos that go back over 100 years. Some include great-great grandparents. Some were taken by my grandfather and my dad. I even have a box full of negatives of images that my dad took during WWII. Of course, I have many photos that I have captured throughout my lifetime. They not only include digital images, but photo albums, prints in envelopes, negatives, slides, and even framed photos on the wall. How do I manage these things? How do I share them? What is the most valuable?

As a photographer and amateur historian, photos are valuable to me. They are like time machines. They may bring memories of places and people that are no longer here. They have captured moments in my life and in the lives of people around me. My brother Bill, who becomes impatient when I take photos, has thanked me for taking family photos over the years because of the memories they have preserved. He and I are in this photo.

I am the historian for Camp Jörn in Manitowish Waters, WI. Over

the last 20 years or so, I have worked on preserving photos of a camp with over 70 years of history. Many of these photos and stories to go with them have been preserved in two books I have worked on.

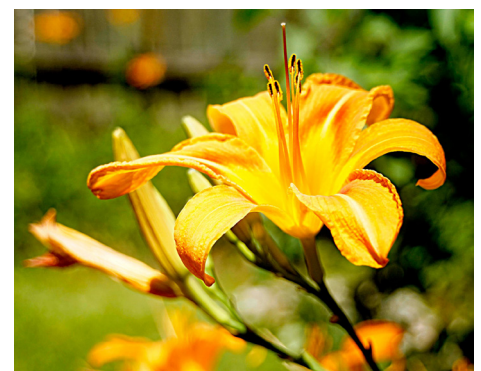
But the question still remains. What do we do with our photos. How do we organize and preserve them? How do we pass them on? How do we get people to care? These are all difficult questions we must consider.

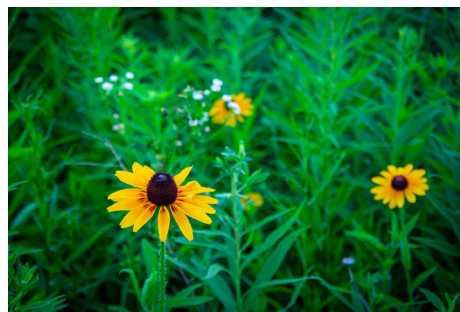
The show and tell theme was cell phone photography led by Paul Ewing.

Several members of the Duneland Photography Club were in attendance:

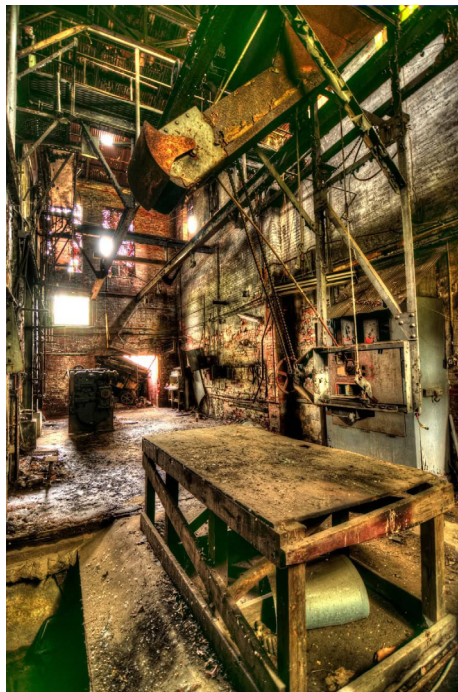
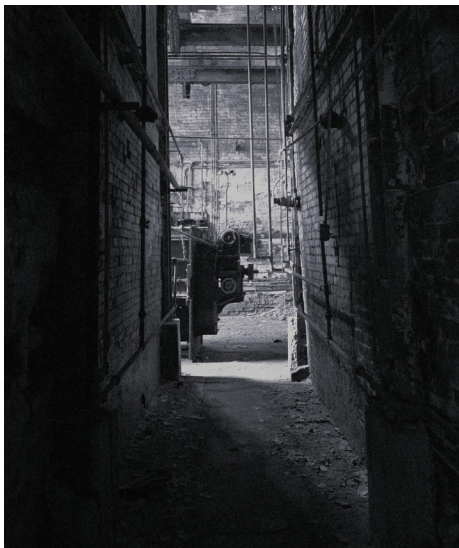
Larry and Lorelei Brown, Steve Bensing, Dina Heijsselaar, Peggy Carter, and Carol Estes.

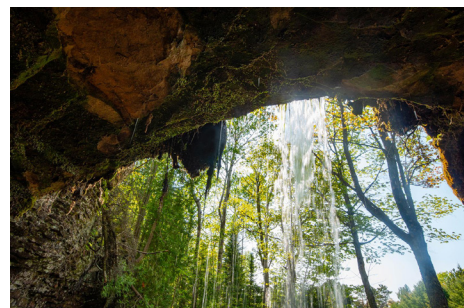


Peggy Carter
